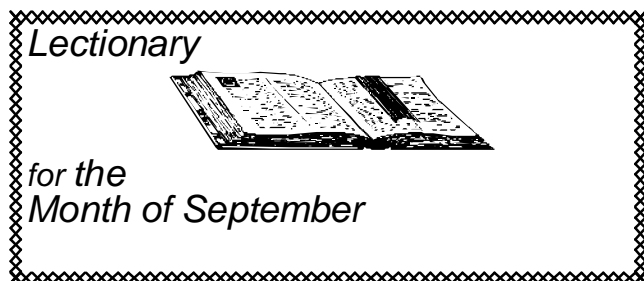

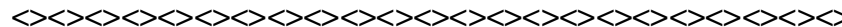
FROM LWML "TODAY'S LIGHT" Sharpen the Focus

“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. . .” (1 Tim. 6:10). Friendships have been destroyed by it. Families have been torn apart by it. Marriages have been wrecked by it. Lives have been ruined by it. . . .Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith. . .” (1 Tim.6:10).

Solomon wisely observed, “Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless” (Eccl. 5:10). If one loves money, he devotes himself to it. He focuses, he plots, he schemes, he labors to acquire more. He lets nothing stand between him and the obtaining of his wealth. But the securing of this wealth is meaningless. It is as if one were chasing the wind.

Jesus said, “What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul?” (Mark 8:36). And St. Paul went on to instruct Timothy, “For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it” (1 Tim.6:7). The worldly pleasures and comfort that money can buy are only short-lived. Compared to eternity, our life is less than a blink of an eye. That which we have accumulated is gone. Naked again, we depart this life.

St. Paul Lutheran School theme for this school year.

“....so that you may become blameless and pure, children of God...in which you shine like stars in the universe.” **Philippians 2:15**

“Shine Like Stars in the Universe” is being repeated throughout our school this year. That theme, taken from Philippians 2:15, is our goal for the 2008-2009 school year. Stars for Jesus.

We have new science textbooks and materials. Teachers have access to a new internet-based program, United Streaming Plus, that allows us to download educational videos that will complete subjects being taught. The seventh and eighth graders will learn about part of the Great Depression Hoovervilles.

The new entry way is just about finished, it will be beautiful. The removal of the house on Ste. Gen., a new blacktop playground, swings that were moved, and new gravel under the playground equipment all make our grounds something we can all be proud of. The perimeter fencing will soon be in place. Many workers, businesses, and helpful individuals made these improvements possible.

If the parking lot or car drop-off line look a little busier this year, there is a good reason. Our total enrollment is up to 214 this year. 57 are in preschool and 157 are in Kindergarten through eighth grade. We ended school last spring with 191 students. Our total is the second highest number of students ever attending St. Paul Lutheran School! Please keep us in your prayers.

From the Finance Board:

As a board we have committed to you to be watchful over the financial condition of our church and to keep you informed with periodic updates. We finished our last fiscal year in a positive way, even with a small surplus; tithe and faith giving's were slightly up. Also, the transfer of the full amount for the specialty teacher's salaries from the auction funds was not necessary to meet the July payroll. So we can thank God for these blessings.

However, we have been looking at a comparison between the first two months of last fiscal year and the first two months of our current fiscal year. At this point we are behind; last year we averaged \$10,000 a week for the first two months while to date we have been averaging about \$7,200 a week. It is because of this decrease in our tithes that we have had to transfer \$20,000 of the auction funds for the specialty teachers to meet the August payroll. This is a situation all of us need to be aware of and we need to keep it in our prayers, lets keep going in a positive direction and not fall into another deficit situation. Let us continue to allow God to work through us to accomplish the great things He is doing here at St. Paul.

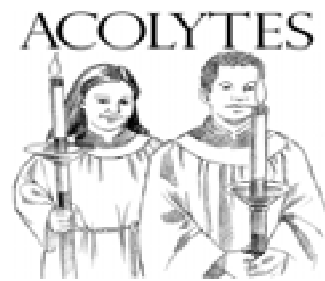
